Memory Support

The Memory Support Center offers a unique environment with specialized programming designed for those with Alzheimer's, Dementia or other related memory impairments. A team of trained professionals follows a Habilitation Therapy Model, ensuring residents experience a carefully supervised, fulfilling and active lifestyle aimed to stimulate memory and independence.



The Habilitation Therapy model is a comprehensive approach to caring for people with dementia by focusing on a person's remaining abilities. Our life enrichment and nursing staff engage the resident's capabilities, independence and morale to produce a consistent state of psychological well-being.



This differs from Rehabilitation Therapy which is designed to return a resident to their previous, higher levels of functioning. Habilitation focuses on optimizing and extending what is possible in the now, allowing for family and friends to enjoy their time together that can produce a more uplifting experience for all involved.

Health Care Services

Grace Rehabilitation and Health Center professionals work together as an interdisciplinary team offering ongoing assessments of each resident's individual needs, members of the team may include:

- On-site Geriatric Specialist
- Registered Nurses
- Licensed Practical Nurses
- Certified Nursing Assistants
- Licensed Rehabilitative Therapists: Occupational, Speech, Physical
- Registered Dietitian and Nutritionist
- Accredited Social Workers/Discharge Planners
- Certified Life Enrichment Director and Staff
- Full-time Chaplain

Social Services

Upon admission, each resident is assigned a Social Services staff member who works to assure the resident's needs are being met. They can act as a liaison between the resident and Wesbury administration, go shopping for personal items as well as assist in making the appropriate plans when they are being discharged by providing information on home and community based services and personal care options.



Wound Care

A member of the Wound Care Team meets with each resident within twenty-four hours of their admittance to Grace Rehabilitation and Health Center. Our nationally recognized Team works with hospitals and wound centers from throughout the region providing a true multidisciplinary approach to wound healing.



Therapy Services

The Rae S. Larcom Therapy Center offers a complete menu of comprehensive rehabilitation services. Our therapists are trained in clinical best practices and advanced clinical programming to restore and maintain an individual's maximum independence level. These services include physical, occupational and speech therapy. Outpatient rehabilitation services are also available.

Life Enrichment

Comprised of several neighborhoods, Grace Rehabilitation and Health Center provides specialized life enrichment programming and staff designated to each neighborhood. Within 72 hours of admittance, the Life Enrichment staff, directed by a Nationally Certified Life Enrichment Director, performs an initial activity assessment recognizing each resident's unique individual interests and abilities. Therapeutic and recreational activities are offered daily and focus on spiritual, physical, emotional, intellectual and social needs and interests. A broad range of innovative programs designed to enhance residents' quality of life through our person-centered approach includes:

Dining Services

Dietary Services meets with each resident to explain dining choices and obtain food preferences. Each neighborhood has a dining room. Residents choose from a menu. The Registered Dietitian reviews each menu for nutritional standards including liberalized diets that follow the Pioneer Networks recommendations for seniors. Each neighborhood also includes:

Frequently Asked Questions

Where do I begin with the admission process?

All potential residents begin by completing an Admissions application that we can mail, email or fax to you. You may also stop in to pick one up.

What paperwork or information do I need to bring for admission?

Please bring the following for your admission paperwork to be complete.

- Power of attorney, living will or any advance directives.
- Medical insurance and prescription cards
- Income and asset information
- Veterans information, benefits and cards
- Photo Identification or driver's license

How do I set up a tour?

Call the Admissions Department at 814-332-9233 to schedule a tour. A maximum of two people are permitted to tour at one time. Scheduled tours are required to allow for comprehensive information to be shared by the Admissions Coordinator and time to meet with the Finance Department.

Is there a waiting list?

Availability varies and is often limited. If an appropriate accommodation is not available at your time of application, we will place you on the waiting list and contact you when there is an opening.

If you are not ready when contacted, you may remain on the waiting list for future openings. In order to serve all of our community members, we cannot hold accommodations for extended periods of time.



How do I pay for my stay?

We accept most 3rd party payers, including V.A., Medicare, and Medicaid. Coverage will vary depending on your plan. Medical Assistance is available for those who qualify.

Our Financial Department will be happy to assist you in planning how to cover the cost of your stay.



Can I transfer to/from another facility?

If at any time a resident should seek care at another facility, our staff will help accommodate the move, and assist in the transfer process. Residents from other facilities, who wish to transfer to Grace Rehabilitation and Health Center, are also welcome. Regular admission requirements apply.

My primary care physician doesn't come to your facility, who will be my doctor?

Grace Rehabilitation and Health Center has a licensed, certified Medical Director on staff who will attend to any residents that need a physician. Other physicians are welcome at Grace Rehabilitation and Health Center; contact Admissions at 814-332-9233 for additional information.

Can I visit my loved one at any time?

Yes, we encourage family members and friends to support their loved ones. Visitors must check in at the Grace lobby and wear a surgical mask during their visit.

Are pets permitted?

Pets are not permitted to stay with residents.

Is Hospice Care available?

Hospice Care is available through a number of providers.

What do I need to bring with me? ***(or for my loved one)***

Most importantly, bring what feels most comfortable; this includes clothes, pictures, a favorite blanket or chair.

Clothing Suggestions

- Soft-soled shoes or athletic shoes with nonskid soles. Backless shoes are not recommended.
- Seven sets of comfortable clothing that you would wear at home. Athletic clothing is ideal for rehabilitation stays such as T-shirts, sweatpants or stretch pants and shorts, if you have had leg surgery
- Underwear and socks
- Pajamas, a robe, and slippers with tread or traction

Toiletries

Wesbury provides deodorant, shampoo, a comb, toothpaste and a toothbrush, denture adhesive and cleaner. We suggest you also bring your preferred personal hygiene products, a hair hairbrush and makeup if applicable.

Other Items to Bring

- Dentures, hearing aids, and/or glasses
- Splints, braces, or orthotics, and customized equipment
- Any assistive devices you own, such as a cane or walker
- The name and phone number of your primary care physician
- A list of any medicines you currently take
- Any prescription plan identification cards
- A living will or advance directives, if applicable
- Power of Attorney documentation, if applicable



Items to Consider Bringing


- Activities for your “off time,” such as books, magazines, cards, etc.
- The phone numbers of relatives and friends, including the numbers for your emergency contacts
- A small pad of paper and a pen
- A laptop computer so you can use the free wireless Internet service

What NOT to bring

- Perfumes, colognes, or scented lotions, due to allergies of others
- Valuables
- Large amounts of cash
- Medications
- Please note that Wesbury is a smoke-free environment and smoking is not permitted

Directions to Wesbury

Traveling north or south on Interstate 79, visitors should take the Meadville exit 147A. This exit places you on a four lane highway which you will follow for approximately 1-1/2 miles before taking the Park Avenue exit into downtown Meadville. Visitors should travel straight through Meadville to the Wesbury campus. Wesbury is approximately 2-1/2 miles from the Park Avenue exit and is located on the right-hand side of the road.
